Pandemic Transparency Cases – March 2022

Open Contracts - Case 1

Order seeking access to undisclosed vaccine contracts with manufacturers and others (COVAX)

Status: On-going

Respondents: Department of Health (and various Pharmaceutical Companies)

Open Decision-making - Case 2

Order seeking information on details of experts advising government and for disclosure of all expert advice issued on prioritisation, eligibility and vaccine selection. Order seeking information on details, approvals that enabled non-healthcare workers to access vaccines first.

Status: On-going
